The Life and Letters of the Apostle Peter

II Peter 2:15-22

"Which have forsaken the right way, and are gone astray, following the way of Balaam the son of Bosor, who loved the wages of unrighteousness; but was rebuked for his iniquity: the dumb ass speaking with man's voice forbad the madness of the prophet. These are wells without water, clouds that are carried with a tempest; to whom the mist of darkness is reserved for ever."

—II Pet. 2:15-17

In 1938 ominous storm clouds began to gather over Europe. The Second World War was inevitable. Hitler had amassed an impressive army. In so doing he intimidated Austria to join him in his cause. After he invaded Poland in the fall of 1939, he conquered Belgium, the Netherlands, and France. Hitler then focused his attention on England. The winds of war were now blowing in her direction. Although England was gripped with fear, she was the last bastion of freedom and hope for Europe.



In the midst of the world's darkest hour came a voice of hope. Sir Winston Churchill stood before a wartime Parliament (May of 1940) and rallied his nation to stand up against the totalitarian beast on the other side of the channel. Churchill declared he could offer only, "Blood, toil, tears, and sweat. You ask: What is our aim? I answer in one word—Victory! It is victory! Victory at all cost! Victory in spite of all terror, victory however long and hard the road may be."

In June of that same year came his greatest address of all. In fact, it has appropriately been called, "His finest hour." "We shall not fail. We shall go on to the end...We shall defend our island, whatever the cost may be. We shall fight on the landing grounds; we shall fight in the fields and in the streets. We shall never surrender."

In similar fashion, Peter rallied his countrymen to stand up against another type of evil beast—*deceivers*, who would rob them of the truth. Peter was not one to sit idly by and watch the faith of his countrymen be overthrown by these so-called visionaries. As the apostle says, "which have forsaken the right way, and are gone astray, following the way of Balaam the son of Bosor, who loved the wages of unrighteousness." Since every Hebrew was taught the Old Testament from childhood, Peter knew his readers were very familiar with the exploits of Balaam. Therefore, he uses the story of Balaam to illustrate how false teachers operate.

Balaam was a hireling prophet who sought to *market* his gift. This is the **way of Balaam**. When Balak, the king of the Moabites, saw how the Amorites were utterly destroyed by the children of Israel, he feared that he was going to suffer the same fate. So he sent the elders of Moab to Balaam with gifts of divination to curse Israel. Balak reasoned that if the prophet

cursed the chosen nation, he would prevail and drive her out of the land. The very fact these bearers of silver and gold were sent to Balaam strongly suggests that the reputation of the prophet preceded him. As they say, money talks, and Balaam was listening. But God would not allow the prophet to return with the elders of Moab, nor did He permit him to curse Israel.

However, temptation always knocks at the door of opportunity more than once. Thus, it does not surprise us when the princes of Moab returned to offer Balaam riches untold and even greater honor throughout the realm. Rather than accept the will of God regarding the matter, he approached the face of the Lord again. Balaam reasoned that since Israel had sinned against God she deserved to be cursed: which. of course, meant he would reap a handsome sum for his effort. He had no concern whatsoever for his countrymen, that many of them would perish, as long as it profited him. This time God gives Balaam the liberty to go, as a test. This shows the true intent of his heart inasmuch as he fully understood it was not God's will for him to go, yet he went. Lust filled his heart!

Interestingly, Balaam's journey was interrupted when the ass upon which he was riding saw the angel of the LORD standing in the way with a sword drawn. Although the money-blinded prophet could not see the angel of the LORD at first, the ass did and turned aside into the field. The second time she crushed his foot against the wall. The third time she saw the angel of the LORD she collapsed beneath the prophet. Each time Balaam beat the ass unmercifully. However, after the third beating, the

dumb ass spoke to him. Now that would leave you speechless! The Lord often uses unique ways to get

our attention. But we must also remember that in this case, nothing is impossible with God (Jer. 32:17 cf. Luke 1:37). Thus, Peter would have us understand it was according to



God's purpose that Balaam was "rebuked for his iniquity: the dumb ass speaking with man's voice forbad the madness [insanity] of the prophet" (See Numbers 22).

Then the Lord opened his eyes and Balaam saw the angel of the LORD standing in the way. It is important to note that this was a preincarnate appearance of Christ, the very One who would redeem Israel from the curse of the law. This was the error of Balaam (Jude 11). He reasoned that a holy God must curse Israel on the basis of His righteousness. But what the hireling prophet failed to understand was the higher purpose of God to redeem Israel at the Cross, where Christ would be made a curse for the sins of His people (Gal. 3:13). Consequently, the Lord rebuked the wayward prophet: "Behold, I went out to withstand thee, because thy way is perverse before me" (Num. 22:32).

After Balaam realized God would not allow him to curse Israel, he deceitfully devised a plan to corrupt Israel. He taught Balak to sway the chosen nation into eating things that had been offered to idols and to commit fornication, both of which were strictly forbidden by God. This is known as the doctrine of Balaam (Rev. 2:14). Israel was only to worship the true

and living God. She was to be a separate nation unto God; therefore, she was not permitted to marry those of other nations. So when the Israelites joined themselves to the daughters of Moab, God sent a plague among His people wherein 24,000 perished (Num. 25:1-9).

Beloved, the false teachers of Peter's day were "following the way of Balaam," that is, they were *imitating* the prophet. Balaamism is a system of teaching that's based purely upon human reasoning. It is worldliness in its worst forms; lust, greed, and personal advancement at the expense of others. The face of evil may change, but its devastating effects are always the same.

WELLS WITHOUT WATER

"These are wells without water, clouds that are carried with a tempest; to whom the mist of darkness is reserved for ever. For when they speak great swelling words of vanity, they allure through the lusts of the flesh, through much wantonness, those that were clean escaped from them who live in error. While they promise them liberty, they themselves are the servants of corruption: for of whom a man is overcome, of the same is he brought in bondage" (II Pet. 2:17-19).

The natural man is inherently religious. Like Cain, he wants to do something to appease God. Satan uses this religious fervor as a means to lead men to perdition. After all, his ministers present themselves as ministers of righteousness wherein they lie in wait to deceive. With persuasive words of man's wisdom, these false teachers were promising liberty from the moral restraints of the *Sermon on the Mount*, according to Peter. But the liberty they promised was in reality a license to sin, which appealed to the flesh.

Perhaps a current example will help us understand how insidious these attacks can be upon the Word of God. The following is an excerpt from *Rescuing the Bible from Fundamentalism* by Richard Ostling, regarding the position of Dr. Spong, a prominent leader in one of the mainline Christian denominations:

"Jesus Christ as portrayed in some New Testament passages is 'narrow-minded' and 'vindictive.' The Gospel writers 'twisted' the facts concerning Jesus' resurrection, which was never meant to be taken literally. The virgin birth of Christ is an unthinkable notion, and there is not much value in the doctrine of the Trinity, or in the belief that Jesus Christ was sent to save fallen humanity from sin."

Ostling states that Mr. Spong "declares his goal is to reveal the spiritual truths underlying the biblical text." He adds that Spong's unorthodoxy has now reached epic proportions in his book, *Living in Sin?* wherein he "asserted that nonmarital sex can be holy under some circumstances."

Peter wasn't afraid to tell it as it was for the sake of those who were under the spell of these unscrupulous teachers. He warns, "These are wells without water, clouds that are carried with a tempest; to whom the mist of darkness is reserved for ever." In the dry, barren desert, wells hold out the promise of life-giving water,

but if the oasis is dried up, those who approach are left destitute. The message of these false teachers was unable to quench the spiritual thirst of their hearers because they themselves were empty wells.

It was Augustine who said, "Thou hast made us for Thyself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee." Only Christ can satisfy the longing of the soul: "In the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink. He that believeth on me, as the Scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water" (John 7:37,38).

There should be no question that these apostates were unsaved when Peter says, "to whom the mist [blackness] of darkness is reserved for ever." Those who purposely lead men to perdition have a special place reserved for them in the lake of fire. Hell is darkness, but Peter reveals that there are degrees of darkness, which would be in keeping with degrees of punishment promised those who blatantly reject the Savior (Matt. 11:20-24 cf. Rev. 20:11-15).

THE GREAT DEBATE

"For if after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, they are again entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning. For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than, after they have known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them" (II Pet. 2:20,21).

The debate has raged for years in Christendom as to whether or not it is possible to lose our salvation. Those who have come to understand the Mystery rest in the truth that we are eternally secure in Christ and, thankfully, have the assurance of it (Rom. 6:23 cf. Eph. 1:13,14). While there are those who believe the kingdom saints could lose their salvation, we are not of that number. We do, however, agree that they did not enjoy the assurance of their salvation, as we saw in an earlier lesson.

First and foremost, the kingdom saints, to whom Peter was writing, are said to be saved. You will recall the woman who washed our Savior's feet with her tears and dried them with her hair. The Lord said to her "Thy sins are forgiven," then added, "Thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace" (Luke 7:36-50). We don't want to weary you, but what did her faith save her from? Obviously, she was saved from her sins and the judgment to come. If she could lose her salvation, as some claim, then what would have this woman been delivered from—it surely could not be her sins, simply because she's once again in jeopardy of the hell-fire judgment.

The Lord said to Nicodemus under this same program, "That whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:15,16). Those who believe in Him here are said to have eternal life. We know from the record that Nicodemus responded to the Master's words and received eternal life. But in what sense did he have eternal life if he could have lost it? It was not eternal if there was ever the possibility of losing it.

Surely this passage should settle the matter that the sheep in Israel, who believed Christ was their "...it's essential to carefully distinguish between an intellectual knowledge of Christ and true saving faith."

Messiah, were eternally secure. "And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand" (John 10:28). If these saints, any one of them, lost their salvation, then would it not have to be said that they were plucked from the Savior's hand? God forbid!

But what then does Peter mean by those who have a knowledge of Christ and if they again become entangled in the pollutions of the world, it would have been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness? Clearly the apostle is addressing the false teachers and those led astray by their cunning ways. They escaped the pollutions of the world, not by conversion, but through an outward knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. Religiously speaking, there were numerous benefits to being closely aligned with the kingdom message. But as one author correctly states, "Now, to be thus re-entangled in evil, after having once escaped it through the professed knowledge of the Lord and Savior, was infinitely worse than if they had not known the way of truth at all."

Judas is a prime example. He was one of the twelve who played the part of a believer so effectively that the other disciples had absolutely no idea he was a worker of iniquity. He ministered alongside them, ate with them, and sat at the

Master's feet as He taught the kingdom gospel. Judas was an opportunist. He saw how his close association with the things of the Lord could benefit him personally. He reveled in the power, the prestige, the respect, the glory, the money. The disciples trusted him so implicitly they made him treasurer of the group (John 12:6).

But the Lord unmasked this unsavory character for who he was—a devil. He plainly said to His disciples, "Have not I chosen you twelve, and one of you is a devil? He spake of Judas Iscariot the son of Simon: for he it was that should betray him, being one of the twelve" (John 6:70,71). To which the Lord added, "Woe unto that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It had been good for that man if he had not been born" (Matt. 26:24). This is also the sense of Peter's words concerning those who wear the cloak of deception for personal gain. "For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than, after they have known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them."

Peter uses two animals to illustrate his point—a dog and a pig—both of which were despised by the Hebrews.

"But it is happened unto them according to the true proverb, The dog is turned to his own vomit again; and the sow that was washed to her wallowing in the mire" (II Pet. 2:22).

We must keep before us here that regeneration is not reformation, but a *transformation*. Furthermore, it's essential to carefully distinguish between an intellectual knowledge of Christ and true saving faith.

A man who *professes* Christ may outwardly appear to have experienced a change in his life, yet his

heart is far from God. He is like the pig that has been washed, but given the opportunity, returns to the mud. You see, it's the pig's nature to do so. So it is with the unbeliever; inwardly he will always return to his sinful ways. The sheep, on the other hand, has no desire to enter the pit, and if it falls in by accident, it wants to be removed and restored—like the believer!

Question Box

"Living the Christian life can be challenging at times. How do we determine what is acceptable to God when there is no direct command of Christ?"

The Word of God is always relevant. It transcends the ages; therefore, if a particular matter isn't dealt with specifically, we are to defer to a broader principle. For example, you may want to ask yourself the question, will my action or participation glorify God? If you have any reservations whatsoever, then you are probably skating on thin ice. Paul says, "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God" (I Cor. 10:31).

Another principle is to "Prove all things; hold fast that which is good. Abstain from all appearance of evil" (I Thes. 5:21,22). Proving has the sense of putting things to the test. If you are remodeling an old house and the steps going upstairs look unsafe, you naturally make sure the steps will hold your weight before you attempt to ascend the stairs. We wouldn't think of placing ourselves in harms way, which should also be true in our spiritual lives.

Test: Should we take possession of something if we are unsure whether or not it rightfully belongs to us? Often, examining the conduct of a servant of God such as Paul will help us *prove* whether our actions will be acceptable to the Lord. When the apostle won Onesimus to Christ at Rome, he could have reasoned that since this runaway slave's slate was wiped clean from past offenses he would claim him as his own. After all, think how profitable Onesimus could have been to Paul in the work of the ministry. But Onesimus rightfully belonged to Philemon, so the aged apostle returned him, along with a letter, to allow Philemon to make that decision. In other words, Paul didn't simply assume his friend would understand; he did what was *right*.

"Yet for love's sake I rather beseech thee, being such an one as Paul the aged, and now also a prisoner of Jesus Christ. I beseech thee for my son Onesimus, whom I have begotten in my bonds.... Whom I would have retained with me, that in thy stead he might have ministered unto me in the bonds of the gospel: *But without thy mind would I do nothing*; that thy benefit should not be as it were of necessity, but willingly" (Phile. 9-14).

Paul, The Apostle of Grace

To the unbiased believer of the Word of God, there is overwhelming proof that the secret of God's eternal purpose and of His good news to man was first communicated by revelation to the Apostle Paul, that he in turn might make it known to others. Not only does Paul himself declare this by divine inspiration but his declarations are amply confirmed by a comparison of his message and ministry with the messages and ministries of all his predecessors.

But while particular distinctions have often been noted in this connection, we feel that too little attention has been given to the broader aspects of his message and ministry as compared with those of his predecessors. Those great, grand truths which he was commissioned to unfold were the constant subject of his discourse and his letters, and his life and conduct harmonized perfectly with those truths and with the dispensation he ushered in.

THE DISPENSATION OF GRACE

Let us begin with his proclamation of *grace*.

We are sometimes asked: "Did not others before Paul speak of grace?"

Yes, others before Paul did speak of grace, but before we assume too much from this, let us consider a few basic facts:

It is not merely Paul, but the inspired Word which declares that "the dispensation of the grace of

God" was committed to him (Eph. 3:2) and that it was his "ministry... received of the Lord Jesus" to make known "the gospel of the grace of God" (Acts 20:24). THIS CLAIM WAS MADE FOR NONE OF HIS PREDECESSORS, nor did any of them even mention the dispensation or the gospel of the grace of God so far as the record is concerned.

To the believer this evidence should be conclusive that Paul was God's chosen vessel, raised up especially to proclaim the message and program of grace. But to those who hesitate to accept these inspired statements at their face value, we have further important evidence to offer in the fact that NO OTHER BIBLE WRITER—NOT EVEN ALL THE OTHERS PUT TOGETHER—HAVE SO MUCH TO SAY ABOUT GRACE.

The Hebrew equivalent of Paul's word for grace is found only 68 times in *the whole Old Testament* (which is nearly *twelve times* the size of Paul's epistles including Hebrews) and then not always relating to *God's* grace, and *never* to *the dispensation of Grace*.

In the four Gospels (nearly *twice* the size of Paul's epistles) the word grace (Gr. *charis*) with its derivatives appears in the original only 13 times (much less often in the English A.V.) and then rarely in even a doctrinal, much less a dispensational, connection.

By comparison, the epistles of Paul, only about one twelfth the size of the Old Testament and onehalf the size of the four Gospels, employs the word grace and its derivatives no less than 144 times, more often than all the rest of the Bible together and nearly twice as often as the whole Old Testament and the four Gospels together! And then, in Paul's epistles the word grace is nearly always used doctrinally, in connection with the dispensation of Grace.

Every epistle signed by his name opens with a proclamation of grace and peace "from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus *Christ.*" In the epistles we find that we are "justified freely by [God's] grace" (Rom. 3:24), that "where sin abounded grace did much more abound" (Rom. 5:20) that grace might reign (5:21). There we read that we are "not under the law, but under grace" (6:14), that "God is able to make all grace abound" toward us that we may "abound to every good work" (II Cor. 9:8), that it is God's purpose for "the ages to come" to "show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us through Christ Jesus" (Eph. 2:7). And we could go on and on adding up the evidence that "the dispensation of the grace of God" was indeed committed especially to Paul to make known to us.

An examination of the book of Acts reveals a similar comparison. There the word *grace* in the original is found four times *before* the raising up of Paul and 12 times *after*. Before the raising up of Paul it is not used once of the dispensation of Grace or of salvation by grace, but in later Acts, after his conversion, not only is the *word* used more often, but immediately it appears in connection with the *dispensation* of Grace.

When Barnabas "had seen the grace of God"in saving Gentiles at Syrian Antioch, he "was glad" (Acts 11:23). When Jews and religious proselytes at Pisidian Antioch received Paul's proclamation of salvation through Christ, without the law, he and Barnabas "persuaded them to continue in the grace of God" (13:38,39,43). At Iconium, Paul and Barnabas gave bold testimony to "the word of His grace" (14:3). Later Peter confirmed Paul's message, publicly declaring his conviction: "We believe that through the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ we [Jews] shall be saved even as they [Gentiles/"(15:11). At Ephesus, Apollos proved helpful to "them... which had believed through grace" (18:27). On his way to Jerusalem Paul declared his determination to fulfill his Christ-given commission "to testify the gospel of the grace of God" (20:24) and then commended the Ephesian elders to "the word of [God's] grace" (20:32).

THE PREACHING OF THE CROSS

Let us next consider Paul's presentation of the death of the Lord Jesus Christ.

It was again by divine revelation that the apostle claimed that his was "the preaching of the Cross," i.e., as good news, and that the theme of his message was "Christ crucified" (I Cor. 1:18,23). Again, THIS CLAIM IS MADE FOR NONE OF HIS PREDECESSORS. Furthermore, this claim also is amply confirmed by a comparison of his writings with those of all his predecessors.

In the Old Testament Scriptures the predictions of our Lord's

death, from Genesis 3:15 on, are purposely veiled in obscurity and we are explicitly told that while the prophets themselves "searched diligently," they did not find out either "what manner of time" or even "what" the Spirit "did signify, when [He] testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ, and the glory that should follow" (I Pet. 1:10-12).

It is the same with the Old Testament *types* of our Lord's death. We can *now* look back at them and exclaim: "God had it in mind all the while!" but we are not told of one single case where those of that day were informed that the death of Christ was being prefigured.

Then when our Lord appeared on earth He did not even *begin* to tell His apostles that He must suffer and die until near the close of His ministry (Matt. 16:21; Mark 8:31; Luke 9:22), and then we read:

"Then Peter took Him, and began to rebuke Him, saying, Be it far from Thee, Lord: this shall not be unto Thee" (Matt. 16:22).

So ignorant were our Lord's own apostles of even the prophesied fact of His death (let alone its meaning) that later, in the very shadow of the Cross, when He told them again how He must suffer and die, they were still nonplused:

"And they understood none of these things: and this saying was hid from them, neither knew they the things which were spoken" (Luke 18:34).

In fact, even at Pentecost, when the death of Christ had become a historical fact, its full accomplishments were not yet revealed or proclaimed. In the early chapters of Acts we do not yet find the death of the Cross proclaimed for salvation. It is rather spoken of as a matter of shame to be repented of. Peter does not offer his hearers Christ's shed blood for the remission of sins, he *charges* his hearers with that blood and demands repentance and baptism for the remission of sins.

But with the raising up of Paul all is changed. The crucifixion takes on a new and wonderful meaning. The Cross, the blood, the death of Christ become the very *theme* of his message. He constantly speaks of them, not in hidden meanings, but in open declaration, *as good news*, as that around which God's eternal purpose revolves and from which all our blessings flow.¹

NO OTHER BIBLE WRITER HAS SO MUCH TO SAY ABOUT THE DEATH OF CHRIST.

By the Spirit, Paul tells us that While we were yet *sinners* Christ died for us (Rom. 5:8).

When we were *enemies*, we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son (Rom. 5:10).

We are saved through *faith* in His blood (Rom. 3:25).

We have *redemption* through His blood (Eph. 1:7).

We are *justified* by His blood (Rom. 5:9).

We are *reconciled* in the body of His flesh, through death (Col. 1:21,22).

We have *peace* through the blood of His Cross (Col. 1:20).

We are *made nigh* by the blood of Christ (Eph. 2:13).

We are *baptized* into His death (Rom. 6:3).

We are made *one Body* by the Cross (Eph. 2:16).

The Covenant of the Law was nailed to the Cross (Col. 2:14).

Through death He destroyed him that had the power of death (Heb. 2:14).

He died that they which live should no longer live unto themselves but unto Him Who died for them and rose again (II Cor. 5:15).

He died that whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with Him (I Thes. 5:10).

Christ crucified is the *power* of God and the *wisdom* of God (I Cor. 1:23,24).

We are to *boast* in the Cross alone (Gal. 6:14).

We are to show forth the Lord's death till He come (I Cor. 11:26).

Little wonder Paul's message is called *"the preaching of the Cross"* (I Cor. 1:18).

Do not fear to be in the minority, for with regard to some of the most important and vital truths the majority, even among God's people, has often been *wrong*.

The Devil and the Mystery

ost Christians know more about the devil than they know about "The Mystery." Even so, they do not know any more about the devil than they should know. They should know more about him, so that they can truthfully say, with Paul, "We are not ignorant of his devices" (II Cor. 2:11). Certainly every Christian should know more about "The Mystery." God wants every Christian to know "The Mystery," and to make it known to others (Eph. 3:9). You say, "Then it would no longer be "The Mystery." Certainly

not. Why after over 2,000 years should this divine truth still be a mystery so far as ninety-nine per cent of God's people are concerned? Can you answer this question? It is true that the devil doesn't want any one to understand or even study this divine truth. But is not God's will to be desired by Christians more than Satan's? Doesn't God's power exceed the devil's power? Satan is mighty. God is almighty. Genuine spiritual Christians know that God's power exceeds Satan's power.

But let's take an inventory. As we take in the world-wide political situation, the distress of nations, with even the so-called Christian nations on the verge of bankruptcy and destruction, we may wonder that Satan has such power after 2,000 years of Christianity. But we believe that Satan knew what he was talking about in Luke 4:6 when he told the Lord Jesus that the kingdoms of the world were under his control. The Lord was right when He called Satan "the prince of this world."

When we consider the millions and millions of people of the world religiously, and see what the devil has done to them, surely we give a hearty "Amen" to the statement of I John 5:19, "the whole world lieth in [the evil one]." In his tricks to keep sinners away from the saving gospel of Christ, Satan is called "the god of this [age]" (II Cor. 4:3,4). To accomplish his purpose with people who want some kind of a so-called Christian religion, the devil transforms himself into an angel of light and instructs his servants to pretend that they are missionaries of Christ (II Cor. 11:13-15).

Then let us consider what the devil has done with Church members who are actually members of Christ's Body, God's one and only Church today. Note God's instructions in Ephesians 4:3-6:

"Endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one Body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling: one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all."

Meditate—"the unity of the Spirit." Where is it found? One faith, one hope of your calling, one baptism. One Body. How many sects and denominations? Several hundred. How many bodies? One Body. Note Ephesians 1:20-23:

"Which He wrought in Christ, when He raised Him from the dead, and set Him at His own right hand in [the heavenlies]. Far above all principality and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come: and hath put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be the Head over all things to the Church, which is His Body, the fulness of Him that filleth all in all."

Christ is in the heavenlies. Christ is the one Head of His one and only Church, which is His Body, "the fulness of Him that filleth all in all."

No matter how loyal, zealous sectarians may defend and contend for their denominational churches, the student of the Word of God knows "Why after over 2,000 years should this divine truth still be a mystery...?"

that "denominationalism" is absolutely unscriptural. There is one, and only one, true Bible Church and that Bible Church is denominated, The Body of Christ, "the fulness of Him that filleth all in all." In Ephesians 3:6 that one Church is called the "Joint-Body" (see the Greek).

Members of Christ's Body are seated with Christ in the heavenlies and are blessed with all spiritual blessings in the heavenlies (Eph. 2:6 and 1:3). One reason why God wants all men to see "The Mystery" is expressed in Ephesians 3:10,11:

"To the intent that now unto the principalities and powers in [the heavenlies] might be known by the Church the manifold wisdom of God, according to the eternal purpose which He purposed in Christ Jesus our Lord."

The Mystery then, is divine truth concerning "the heavenlies" and "according to the eternal purpose which God purposed in Christ Jesus our Lord." By searching the Scriptures we find that this divine message was not in fulfillment of prophecy, but was a spiritual program predestinated by God before the foundation of the world.

We have seen how Satan works politically as "the prince of this world"; how, as "the god of this age" he blinds the unbeliever to keep him from believing the gospel of salvation. In Ephesians 6:11-20 we learn of Satan's spiritual wickedness *in the heavenlies*, his opposition to the message and the messenger of "The Mystery," divine truth concerning *the heavenlies*. Note Ephesians 6:11,12:

"Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places [in the heavenlies]."

And note Ephesians 6:19,20:

"And [pray] for me, that utterance may be given unto me, that I may open my mouth boldly, to make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in bonds: that therein I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak."

Why was Paul a prisoner of Rome? Hear his own words: for *"the mystery of the gospel."* Read this again in Colossians 4:3,4 and hear his testimony in Ephesians 3:1-3:

"For this cause I Paul, the prisoner of Jesus Christ for you Gentiles. If ye have heard of the dispensation of the grace of God, which is given me to you-ward: how that by revelation He made known unto me the Mystery; (as I wrote afore in few words)."

Note God's Word in Ephesians 3:9:

"And to make all men see what is the [dispensation] of the Mystery, which from the beginning of the world hath been hid in God."

Here we see "the dispensation of the grace of God" and the dispensation of the Mystery are linked together. This glorious truth was made known by revelation to the Apostle Paul, who became the prisoner of Jesus Christ for the Gentiles. Do we appreciate what he suffered for us? Let's get into the Book and try to understand the message for which he suffered.

While Paul knew that religious men were opposed to "The Mystery" and were determined that he should not preach that divine truth, he knew that he was not wrestling against flesh and blood; that his real opponent was the devil as the ruler of world darkness in the heavenlies.

Paul wrote in II Corinthians 4:3 and 4 that Satan blinded minds. But note his request for a very specific prayer in Ephesians 1:17,18:

"That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him: the eyes of your understanding being enlightened, that ye may know what is the hope of His calling, and what the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints."

Paul did not want minds blinded to "The Mystery." He knew that it required a special spirit of wisdom and revelation to comprehend that particular glorious truth.

Yes, the devil succeeded in getting Paul in jail for "The Mystery," bound as an evil doer unto chains. But from his prison cell he wrote: "The Word of God is not bound."

God wants you to know and to make known this glorious truth...which should have ceased to be a mystery more than twenty centuries ago.



Are We to Exalt Paul?

Romans 11:13

"For I speak to you Gentiles, inasmuch as I am the apostle of the Gentiles, I magnify mine office" (Rom. 11:13).

Of course we are not to exalt the Apostle Paul, or any of the other apostles found in the Bible. The message of the Bible is that Jesus Christ is to be exalted as the Lord of glory, the King of kings, Lord of lords, and the glorified Head of the Church which is His Body.

On the other hand, we should pay special attention to that which the Lord has placed special emphasis on. Paul's declaration that "I speak to you Gentiles; inasmuch as I am the Apostle of the Gentiles; I magnify mine office (ministry)" (Rom. 11:13) is inspired by God and preserved for us in the Bible as part of God's special revelation to mankind. As such it holds as much authority as any other portion of the

Holy Scriptures. When we compare this with Paul's statement that the Lord Jesus Christ Himself gave him the gospel message he preached by an act of special revelation (Gal. 1:11-12), our interest in what Christ has to say to us through Paul should be intensified. James, Peter, and John limited their ministry to the Jews when they came to understand the grace given to Paul (Gal. 2:6-9). When they understood Paul's special apostleship and message, they honored Paul's office or ministry to the Gentiles (nations).

In Ephesians 3:1-7, it is clearly stated that the Dispensation of the Grace of God was given to Paul through "the revelation of the mystery" (secret) that was not known by man before (see Rom. 16:25). If God has seen fit to magnify Paul's ministry of grace, dare we ignore it?
